## Worship Opportunities

Our **Main Sanctuary** service combines the power of tradition with contemporary readings, reflections and music which guide us through the challenges and ultimate rewards of this time of repentance and renewal. This service is open to all. Parents are advised to consider their own child's ability to behave appropriately during this 2 hour service to assure that everyone's religious experience is meaningful.

**Family Services** are geared towards families with young children (8 and under). This hour long service offers opportunities for children and adults alike to join in both traditional and contemporary song and prayer while sharing in stories and special Torah readings reflective of the mood of the season.

Based on last year's success, we are once again offering our **TAS Youth Program for grades K-6**. Children participate in High Holy Day games, snacks, a craft project, a story/drama activity, and a short age-appropriate service. These services will be held on Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur mornings (on Yom Kippur only during B Service). Tickets are not required, but you must RSVP by calling the Temple Office or visiting our website.

**Our Alternative Service** is for those looking for a more intimate service. We will focus on alternate modes of worship including personal meditation and journal writing.
