Meet the organizations we are collaborating with:

## **SOVA:**

Much more than a food pantry, JFS/SOVA, a TAS Social Action Partner, provides free food and an array of supportive services to over 10,000 individuals of all ages, ethnicities and religions each month.

## **Tree People:**

A leader in providing sustainable solutions to urban ecosystem problems through: environmental education, forestry programs, demonstration projects and policy outreach.

**Operation Gratitude:** Seeking to lift morale and put smiles on faces by sending care packages addressed to individual Soldiers, Sailors, Airmen and Marines deployed in harm's way, to their children left behind, and to Wounded Warriors recuperating in Transition Units.

## **LA Family Housing:**

A TAS Social Action Partner, LAFH operates the San Fernando Valley's largest shelter and transitional housing facilities for homeless individuals and families.

## **Jewish World Watch:**

A TAS Social Action Partner, JWW is a hands-on leader in the fight against genocide and mass atrocities, engaging individuals and communities to take local actions. that produce powerful global results.

## **E-Waste Fundraising:**

Kerry Cox founded E-Waste Fundraising in early 2009, with the aim of raising money to pay for medical costs and treatments for his granddaughter, which was diagnosed with leukemia. Now, E-Waste is helping organizations to raise funds, while helping the environment.

**Friends of the IDF:** was established in 1981 by a group of Holocaust survivors to provide for the wellbeing of the men and women who serve in the Israeli Defense Forces (IDF) as well as the families of fallen soldiers.

**Frank D. Lanterman Regional Center** is a private, non-profit corporation that operates under contract with California's Department of Developmental Services. The Center serves over 7,000 children and adults with developmental disabilities, who have or are at risk for a developmental delay or disability, and who are at high-risk of parenting an infant
