

A REFORM JEW LOOKS AT ISRAEL THROUGH AN ORTHODOX PRISM

I just returned from two weeks in Israel – my 60th birthday gift to myself. I researched a variety of tours – some multi-denominational – some women only – and decided that I wanted to tour with a Jewish group that was reasonably priced. I wanted to experience Shabbat in Jerusalem. I have now learned that a tour that includes “2 kosher meals each day” is code for “everyone is Orthodox.” I was assured by the tour company that I would certainly fit in with the others in my group. I asked the questions at least 20 different ways. I travelled; it turns out, with a group that really didn’t know what to make of me – a Reform Jew. One of the couples, a lovely Hungarian couple from Borrough Park, would never ever understand women sitting with men at shul, much less being counted in a minyan – or that I can lead a shiva minyan. They hoped that the trip would make me more religious. I’ve always thought of myself as religious - in Israel, I’m considered non-observant or secular.

– what a difference 45 years makes!

I spent the summer of 1970 there – what a difference 45 years makes! I looked at the snake path to the top of Masada (the only way in 1970) from the cable car, read all of the signs with explanations of the areas on Masada, refilled my water bottle from the faucets now available, but could not bring myself to go to the McDonalds near the gift shop. Tombs I visited then are now accessible through check points, and surrounded by lots of concrete walls and barbed wire.

My first Erev Shabbat was spent with a religious couple originally from the Valley. Lots of fascinating Torah discussion at dinner. I reached out to the Reform

congregations in Jerusalem by email in the hopes of connecting for my second Shabbat. I got a call from Rabbi Stacey Blank from Kehilat Tsur Hadassah to invite me to Erev Shabbat services, and an invitation from Yossi Ben Dor, the president of the congregation to join his family for Shabbat dinner. I recognized Rabbi Blank’s Midwest accent

right away. Of course I had to join her – she went to Beachwood High School (my alma mater – MANY years after me) with the children of my best friend. The community (about 8000 people) of Tzur Hadassah sits on the “green line” where a majority of residents are considered “non-observant.” The congregation serves about 80 families – Rabbi Blank told me that membership in a Reform congregation is a bit of a political statement.



I went to a Bat Mitzvah service on Shabbat at Kehilat Har-El in Jerusalem, walking distance from my hotel. I totally fit in – could keep up with the prayers, knew the tunes. Something about saying the Shema with people from all over the world really hit me. The Bat Mitzvah apparently had endured some pressure from her friends, according to Cantor Evan Cohen - they thought it unnecessary for a girl.

What that Shabbat brought home for me is the importance of the Reform movement in Israel – to continue to push for an acceptance of Jews of all backgrounds, so that all Jews can feel welcome and equal. I am awaiting the results of the recent World Zionist Congress elections. I wish I had paid more attention before my trip.




BOOK GROUP TO FEATURE KENNETH BONERT'S "THE LION SEEKER" JUNE 11




