



Drawing on the boys' own journals and vivid memories of a once-ina-lifetime shared dream, Brown has created an unforgettable portrait of an era, a celebration of a remarkable achievement, and a chronicle of one extraordinary young man's personal quest. In addition to Joe, you will meet some other interesting young men. You will also learn about the sport and how all the pieces come together to make the men and their boat one. A fascinating story you will throughly enjoy.

NCAA BASKETBALL SQUARES



You know MoTAS by many names: the Men of TAS, the TAS Men's Club, or the Brotherhood. They all represent the same thing: the group of men who provide service to TAS. MoTAS Spring Sports Squares program has a similarly shifting name. Whether we call it Basketball Squares, March

Madness Squares, or NCAA Championship Squares - it all represents the same thing: the Spring installment of our Sports Squares program that helps numerous temple programs.

The procedure is very similar to the Superbowl Squares. Basketball Squares cover the last four games in the NCAA championship: the semifinal and final games on April 2-4, 2016. Squares are \$18, and adults may purchase up to 3 squares for themselves, and 3 squares for their partner. Payouts are \$150 for both the halftime and final scores of each game. You can win once or twice in a game. If the board is not fully subscribed, the payout is proportional

based on the number of subscribed squares. To address the possibility that all 100 squares might not be subscribed, the following is the procedure for empty squares that win: each player will make a guess as to what the total number of points will be (i.e., you add the final scores of both teams). This number will be used to settle all cases, for all games. If you purchase more than one square your "number" will apply for all your squares. Closest to actual score wins (payouts divided with ties). If there is no halftime winner, the final score prediction will still be used.

Squares must be purchased by March 30, 2016. Forms should be available in the Temple Foyer. Remember that the real winner is Temple Ahavat Shalom. With a fully subscribed board, \$900 will be available to support specific temple activities, organizations, and projects.

Our Dinner will consist of traditional Passover foods -water, wine, homemade charoset, and more (maybe even gefilte fish) -- as well as barbeque chicken and tri-tip from one of our favorite BBQs in Northridge (for what man doesn't love barbeque). The cost for the meal and the service is \$20. The schedule is as follows: 5:30 p.m. sign-in and snacks; 6:00 p.m. - service and dinner. This is especially important now, as we are seeing an increase in antisemetic violence both in Europe and in the US, and as we are losing the generation of Holocaust survivors. 



2016 BASKETBALL SQUARES

The Men of Temple Ahavat Shalom (MoTAS) announce the 2016 edition of "Basketball Squares," the NCAA Final Four version of our popular "Football Squares" game for the semifinal and final games in the NCAA Basketball Championships, April 2-4, 2016. The earnings from this program (potentially as much as \$900) are used to supports special Temple programs and needs; funding that is above and beyond money available from normal TAS budget allowances.

A brief reminder of how the game works:

- 1. There is a chart set up, numbers 0-9 across the top for the "home" team (the school located closer to TAS) and the "away" team, and the numbers are randomly arranged. There are 100 total squares on the board. Your \$18 contribution gives you one square in the grid. As the grid numbers are randomly selected, it makes no difference where your square is.
- 2. Payouts are \$150 for both the halftime and final scores of each game. You can win once or twice in a game. If the board is not fully subscribed, the payout is proportional based on the number of subscribed squares.
- 3. To address the possibility that all 100 squares might not be subscribed, the following is the procedure for empty squares that win: each player will make a guess as to what the total number of points both teams will score. This number will be used to settle all cases, for all games. If you purchase more than one square your "number" will apply for all your squares. Closest to actual score wins (payouts divided with ties). If there is no halftime winner, the final score prediction will still be used. For example: NCAA 73-59 = "132"
- 4. Any adult is eligible to play. A player can reserve up to 3 squares and up to 3 more for their partner/spouse.

Official rules, an on-line signup form, and printable signup forms are on the MoTAS website at <u>http://squares.tasnorthridge-motas.org</u>. Payment must be received by Wednesday, March 30, 2016. Unpaid squares will be cancelled and made available to other participants.

Your support of this program is greatly appreciated. You might win some money, but the Temple is the big winner! A warm "Thank you" from the Men of TAS.


