Join the TAS team! Do your part to help innocent victims of human rights abuses around the world by participating in the **Jewish World Watch Walk to End Genocide**.


JWW's 8th Annual Los Angeles Walk will be held **Sunday**, **April 27, 2014** at **Pan Pacific Park**, 7600 Beverly Blvd. from **9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m**. The Walk is a 5K around the Park and is on paved surfaces. Registration begins at 9:00 a.m. and the Walk program starts at 10:00 a.m. JWW has arranged for parking at Pan Pacific Park and at the CBS Parking lot accessible off of North Genesee Ave. Carpooling is encouraged.

Visit the Global Village Festival, before and after the Walk, for information and advocacy booths on Darfur, Sudan, Congo and other human rights abuses, conflict minerals campaign and other advocacy opportunities, solar cooker demonstrations, crafts, merchandise, food, music and more. For more details and to sign up for the walk, visit walktoendgenocide.org. TAS' Jewish World Watch liaison Jill Cullen has created a team for our walkers under "Team TAS" on the web site. If you are unable to walk yourself, you may also participate and support the event from this web site as a "virtual walker".

If you are unable to participate on April 27, you and your family may also choose to walk in the Conejo Valley event the following Sunday, May 4, at **Temple Etz Chaim/United Methodist Church of Thousand Oaks, 1080 E. Janss Road**, from **11:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m**. (again, sign up under "Team TAS" on the web site).

**April is Genocide Awareness and Prevention Month.** Join JWW as we commemorate the 99th anniversary of the Armenian genocide and the 20th anniversary of the Rwandan genocide. Stay after the Walk for the Los Angeles Museum of the Holocaust's Yom HaShoah (Holocaust Remembrance Day) program beginning at 2PM.

We are delighted to honor both couples for their continuing support of their TAS community. Mazel Tov!



## BOOK GROUP WILL DISCUSS "ONCE WE WERE BROTHERS" ON APRIL 3


Please join the TAS Book Group in the Library/Chapel on Thursday evening, April 3, as Howard Schnee facilitates the discussion of Ronald H. Balson's gripping legal thriller, *Once We Were Brothers.* The novel takes the reader from pre-war Poland and the Holocaust to modern-day Chicago, where decades later a prominent civic leader and philanthropist, Elliot Rosenzweig, is confronted at the opera by 83-year-old Ben Solomon, who accuses Rosenzweig of being former SS officer Otto Piatek, the "butcher of Zamosc." Even more surprising, Solomon claims that as a child Rosenzweig was abandoned by his parents and went to live with Ben's family in Zamosc. Although the charges are widely denounced as preposterous, Solomon is convinced he is right and engages attorney Catherine Lockhart to bring Rosenzweig to justice. But has Solomon accused the right man?

## THE TRADITION OF GIVING

Each Thursday, after she made her chicken soup and sponge cake, Frieda Lieber removed her apron and donned her sensible black straw hat. Shopping bags in hand, she climbed aboard a bus and headed for her deliveries. There was soup and cake for the sick members of our Jewish community, and cash for our beloved Sinai Temple. At the end of her deliveries, she would show up at my childhood home asking us to call a cab and pay the driver because as usual she gave away every penny she had. My grandmother of blessed memory, Frieda Lieber, taught me early on about repairing the world, one bowl of chicken soup at a time, and supporting the synagogue with whatever you can spare.

One of the ways to support the synagogue that became tradition in the Reform movement for so many years was to mark a special occasion, the recovery from an illness, celebrate a milestone or remember someone who has died by making a donation to a temple fund. There is no requirement for the amount donated, and it is a lovely way to let someone know you are thinking about them.

TAS has many funds that help in a myriad of ways. My two favorite funds are the Vi and David Lieber Memorial Music Fund, which I established years ago after the death of my dear parents. My Mom, Vi Lieber, sang in the choir at Sinai Temple in Michigan City, IN for years. My dad, David Lieber, loved temple music. It was fitting, and it benefits our musical programs. My other favorite fund is Caring Community. These funds help pay for the dinners prepared by a crew of dedicated women for those who are sick or in need of sustenance; for the sheloshim bags that are delivered at the end of the 30 day mourning period to those who have suffered a loss; for the cards and postage for the notes this committee sends to grieving congregants, sick congregants, and those celebrating the birth of a new baby and for a variety of other things this committee provides for which there is virtually no budget.

Please, consider making this part of your family's tradition.

Remember, honor, and mark an occasion with a donation that will benefit your temple. Teach your children that this is what Jews do, especially those Jews who make up the remarkable TAS community.

## MARCH 13, 2014 TAS SISTERHOOD WELCOMED DOCUMENTARY FILMMAKER GABRIELA BOHM.



Ms. Bohm presented her latest film "Raquel," followed by questions and answers. Over 45 members and guests enjoyed the presentation.

"Raquel" is the engrossing story of Raquel Liberman, a young Polish immigrant to Argentina in the early 20th century. Due to the death of her husband, Raquel found herself a virtual prisoner in a brothel run by the Jewish Mafia in Buenos Aires. How Raquel survived, escaped, and ultimately helped bring down the mafia was an amazing and true story. Ms. Bohm has produced other films, including "The Longing," the true story of Conversos, the Jews forced during the Inquisition to become Catholic and their attempts to reclaim their Judaism. She also produced "Passages," the story of one woman's search for her family history and roots from Argentina through Hungary, Romania, and Israel.

Bohm will be one of the filmmakers at the Jewish Film Festival later this year.


