## **SONIA'S JOURNEY**

#### A NOTE FROM RABBILUTZ

At the end of the last day of school on May 18th, a teary eyed Mrs. Liberman, approached me to announce that she would not be returning to Ahavat Shalom in the fall. Later this summer, Sonia will be moving to Portland where her son Gershon and his family reside. For 48 years Mrs. Liberman has served this community with incredible passion, devotion and love for every single student and family that crossed the threshold of her classroom.

On Friday evening, June 20, at 6:15p.m. as part of our Shabbabaque, we will honor Sonia for sacred service to our community. I hope you will be able to join us. We are also collecting words of blessing, reflections and stories to be placed in a special memory book for

Mrs. Liberman. Below is an article written by Fran Krimston on the occasion of Mrs. Liberman's 40th year at Temple Ahavat Shalom.

Can you remember when you were 7 years old? Your life was probably filled with play, a comfortable home, loving parents who cared for you, fed you, saw to your education and healthcare. You felt loved, comforted and secure.

As a 7 year old growing up in Kleztk, Poland, Sonia Berkowitz had a far different experience. She was raised in a modern, yet traditional home where Judaism and Hebrew were very important. After the Nazis ghettoized the 3,500 Jews of her hometown in 1940, her parents sent her and her siblings—a sister, 17, and a brother, 12, to stay on a farm with a non-Jewish friend who had been a teacher at their school. Her father said the fresh air and better food would



be good for the children. As the High Holy Days approached, the older children decided to return home to be with their parents. They told Sonia because she was so young that it was too dangerous for her to go with them as they needed to travel at night.

After Rosh Hashanah, someone came to the farm to tell Sonia that the entire Jewish population had been rounded up and shot by the Nazis. Her family had been murdered. She was an orphan. One can only imagine what went through this terrified child's head. Her life, as she knew it, had been shattered.

Her protector, the teacher turned farmer, owed her father a debt of gratitude. A good man, he promised Sonia he would keep her safe for as long as he could. He told her she had

a rich heritage, but she would have to pretend to be Christian and they would change her name. Some months passed, and a neighbor told the farmer that people knew he was harboring a Jewish child. Because he and his family were in grave danger, he took Sonia to a convent, where the nuns once again changed her name, baptized her and placed a chain with a cross around her neck. He also told her to remember that she had an uncle in America, two aunts in Mexico and an aunt in Palestine.

During the next years she was shuttled between the farm, the Black Forest where she lived with partisans and the convent, always one step ahead of the Gestapo. Somehow, this plucky little girl survived more horror than anyone can imagine.

After the war, the teacher found her and brought her back to his farm until the Jewish agencies gathered up the orphans in an attempt to return some normalcy and Jewishness to

their lives. This, however, was not an easy task. Sixty-eight children were moved to Chechen, then to Lodz to a Jewish orphanage. They had to flee Lodz in the middle of the night because they were warned that anti-Semites were coming to burn down their dormitory. They ran to a train station and were told a train would be coming, but it could not stop. They were instructed to jump on the train as it slowed down. By some stroke of luck, the terrified youngsters all made it onto the train.

They were given new identities and taken to the Czech border, where the Jewish agency bribed the guards with cigarettes, and the guards pretended to try to stop them by shooting in the air as they ran through the border. Their next stop was Prague, then they traveled by train to Hamburg, and once again Sonia received a new name. The entire group was then sent to Paris and on to Lyon where Sonia stayed in a school until the spring of 1948.

In May, the children were sent to Marseilles where they boarded the "Exodus" for Palestine. After many hours they were taken off the ship and days passed until they finally boarded another ship for the Promised Land. After years of being displaced in foreign countries and learning new languages and customs, Sonia had a future.

They arrived in Haifa at night and were met by a band playing "Hatikvah." After climbing down the precarious rope ladder of the ship, they were presented with oranges, something they had never seen or tasted. Many new challenges awaited these war-torn orphans who had been tossed from border to border, alone and homeless.

Sonia ended up living in a tent in Kibbutz Merchavia. Life was not easy. There was a language barrier, and the conditions were harsh, but she was able to go back to school and studied practical nursing. There were bombings by the Arabs and the Brits, and she and the other kibbutzniks were told to run to the bomb shelter. She often balked at doing this. One of the soldiers always checked to make sure she went to the shelter was very annoying, but eventually that annoyance turned to love. The soldier was Shalom (Sam) Liberman z'l, who Sonia married in 1953.

Miraculously, her far-flung aunts and uncle found her and came to visit her. Besides enjoying having a family again, Sonia was thrilled when each of the relatives brought photos and letters that her parents had written to them. At last she had regained a connection to her history and could hold mementos of her dear parents and siblings.

Sam and Sonia moved into a new home in Petak Tikvah under a program created by Golda Meier. She promised

young couples that if they had a baby, they would get a brand new house. Gershon was their first born. Adi arrived next. The Libermans came to Los Angeles in 1960, where daughter Ruthie was born in 1963.

The words her father said to her as a young child have motivated her—"Your knowledge will always be with you." Sonia received her license as a Vocational Nurse in Israel in 1951. In 1975 she earned an A.A. in Liberal Arts at LA City College, and in 1977 she was awarded a B.A. in Jewish Studies from the University of Judaism. She went on to complete her Master's Degree. Sonia has been awarded the Distinguished Educator Award by the Bureau of Jewish Education.

I asked Sonia how she was able to create the rich life she has led following her shattered childhood. She replied, "I decided nothing would stop me. Whatever was, was. I will create my own family."

Her distinguished career as a Jewish Educator includes teaching Hebrew and Jewish studies at Stephen S. Wise Temple Day School, North Hollywood High School, Temple Emanuel Community Day School, Valley Beth Shalom Day School and Nursery School, Temple Beth Shalom, Whittier and Temple Beth Ami, Reseda. She has made a lasting imprint on the lives of generations of our own children here at TAS.

Rabbi Barry Lutz says, "Sonia's commitment to the Jewish community, and especially to our children is unparalleled. She teaches with energy and enthusiasm that is limitless. When I want a new teacher to understand what teaching in a religious school is all about, it is to Sonia's class that I send them. There they come to understand what love of Judaism and dedication to our future is all about."

Perhaps the words one of her former students wrote to Sonia 15 years ago best sum up our feelings for Sonia Liberman. In 1996 Joan Krimston wrote:

"Dear Sonia: You have touched so many lives here at TAS. Through your wisdom, you convey the necessary pieces of language, history and tradition to empower us to be Jewishly-knowledgable. Through your passion, you create an experience for your students which helps nourish our Jewish spirits. Through your love and respect for each individual who you encounter, you teach us how to be compassionate human beings. Your ways are ways of pleasantness. You are a tree of life to us. With great love and affection, we celebrate you in your 25th year at TAS, and we thank you for enabling us to feel comfortable in our Jewish selves."






## BOOK GROUP WILL DISCUSS DEFENDING JACOB ON JUNE 12



## TAS GIFT MEMBERSHIP PROGRAM - 2014-2014 - Q & A

## WHAT IS THE GIFT MEMBERSHIP PROGRAM?

The program is aimed at bringing in new members and strengthening current members' ties to TAS. A key element in this program is the Sponsor-Recipient relationship.

#### **HOW THE PROGRAM IS DESIGNED TO WORK:**

This is a program designed to give our TAS Members in good standing ("good standing" is defined as member dues which are paid current, prior to, and including the month of High Holy days) an opportunity to gift a free, one-year membership to their unaffiliated friends and family. Our 2013-2014 TAS Gift Member Program has proven that recipients of these gift memberships have a high likelihood of future affiliation because they already have a connection to TAS.

Gift Members receive the same benefits of membership as any other members. As with any membership, Shabbat Services, adult education, High Holy Day tickets, and all other services a paying member receives are available.

#### DO THE SPONSORS HAVE TO PAY ANYTHING?

No, they just have to maintain their member-in-good-standing status. There is no cost to the Sponsor.

## DO THE SPONSORS RECEIVE ANY FINANCIAL COMPENSATION OR DUES REDUCTION?

There is no financial compensation or dues reduction.

## WHEN DOES THE GIFT MEMBERSHIP TAKE EFFECT? HOW LONG DOES IT LAST?

The gift membership is valid during the July 1, 2014-June 30, 2015 fiscal year. Regardless of which month the gift membership begins, it will expire on June 30, 2015.

## WILL ALL NEW MEMBERS WHO JOIN DURING THAT TIME JOIN FOR FREE?

Only those Recipient members that are introduced and have a current in-good-standing member sponsor can participate in the Gift Membership Program.

# WHAT ABOUT ECEC. RELIGIOUS SCHOOL & HEBREW SCHOOL TUITIONS? IS EVERYTHING INCLUDED?

The Gift Membership covers dues only. It does not cover the ECEC, Religious School, Bar/Bat Mitzvah, and/or Confirmation fees.

## CAN A GIFT MEMBERSHIP RECIPIENT SPONSOR OTHERS?

Recipients cannot be sponsors.

## CAN PREVIOUS MEMBERS RECEIVE A GIFT MEMBERSHIP?

Yes. Any person who was a member in good standing prior to July 1, 2012, may receive a Gift Membership.

## HOW MANY GIFT MEMBERSHIPS CAN A MEMBER SPONSOR?

There is no limit to the number of gift memberships a member may sponsor.

## DO THE GIFT MEMBERSHIP RECIPIENTS HAVE ANY OBLIGATIONS?

Yes, Gift Member recipients must attend a minimum of 3 Temple events throughout their Gift Membership; including, but not limited to, Friday night services and Temple events (such as Purim Carnival, Cantor's Concert, Synaplex, etc.). We have found that our members who attend our worship services, programs and activities regularly are able to connect and integrate into the TAS community.


