TURNING OUT IN FORCE TO COMBAT GENOCIDE



TAS Social Action Partner Jewish World Watch held its 8th Annual Walk to End Genocide on Sunday, April 27th at Pan Pacific Park – and our congregation turned out in large numbers for this 5K Walk. This year, 68 TAS participants signed up, raising \$2,100 for Jewish World Watch, placing TAS in the top five of all congregations participating citywide.

As part of the event, JWW commemorated the 99th anniversary of the Armenian genocide and the 20th anniversary of the Rwandan genocide, in addition to the



Los Angeles Museum of the Holocaust's Yom HaShoah (Holocaust Remembrance Day) program following the walk. Each year's event underscores that we will not stand idly by while human rights violations continue to impact the lives of innocent men, women and children.

TAS HELPS STAMP OUT HUNGER



It was a busy night on May 10th at MEND (Meet Each Need with Dignity), a TAS Social Action Partner. TAS Members Judy Stehr, Rick Mervis, Randy and Laura Wasoff, Ken Bernstein, Emily Bernstein and Efrat Yakobi participated in the annual largest one day national food drive -- "Stamp Out Hunger."

This effort is led by the U.S. Postal Service, whose postal carriers collect canned food donations as part of their daily route. Volunteers then worked either at the local Post Offices or at MEND in Pacoima to sort and separate foods for later distribution to needy families and individuals. The huge truckloads of donations, later transferred to pallets for storage, are truly a sight to behold. This one-day drive helps support one of the San Fernando Valley's largest food pantries all the way through summer and most of the fall months.
