A STAFF BACKPACK IS A STATUS SYMBOL

Two weeks ago my youngest daughter became a Bat Mitzvah; she led the community in worship, read Torah, and took her first steps toward becoming a Jewish adult. A week later my oldest daughter was confirmed, publicly affirming her commitment to Judaism as she ended her formal Jewish education. And then this week she took a different type of step toward Jewish adulthood: she became a CIT and received her staff backpack at URJ Camp Newman.

My three daughters have grown up in the Camp Newman community, and a staff backpack is a status symbol — it is as much a sign of Jewish adulthood as wearing a tallit. It is an outward symbol of her new role at camp — that she is taking on some responsibility, and is on her way to becoming an adult member of the Camp Newman community.

It was a big moment for all the CITs, and as they received their camp shirts, backpacks and clipboards, their excitement was heard throughout camp. In the world of summer camp it is clear what “growing up” means: campers mark growth from summer to summer by what session they are in and

what privileges come with it — such as getting to stay up later, getting more free time, and eventually getting more responsibility. For CITs, that responsibility includes welcoming campers on arrival day singing “Heveynu Shalom,” performing their Saturday night skit, and singing the “Lai Lai” song as campers make their way out of the dining hall on Shabbat.

The path to Jewish adulthood is filled with many milestones, and it is incredible to watch these emerging Jewish adults create their own CIT community while participating in the larger camp community. Part of being a Jewish adult means educating the next generation, and CITs know that they are passing on a love of camp that their CITs had shared with them. My daughter has great memories of all of her CITs and this summer she recognizes that now it’s her turn, teaching them how to make friendship bracelets... and spreading the joy of being part of a Jewish community.



MAKE LIFELONG FRIENDS: JOIN A HAVURAH

Havurah, which means friendship, fellowship or even family, are small groups of like-minded people who gather to share communal experiences like lifecycle events, Jewish learning and socializing within and outside of the context of the Temple. We have found that long lasting connections are made and when a Havurah comes to services or a Temple event,

they have a greater sense of belonging because their extended family is there with them. Havurot (plural) cling together in times of great joy and in times of sorrow.

Being part of a Havurah has always been a very important part of our families' Temple life. We would love to be able to help more of you get involved in such a group. Setting up a Havurah group is not a science, but there are helpful guidelines which have been created and tested over the years. We will send you a separate e-mail asking you to answer a few questions to let us know your interests so we can try to match you with groups of people who want similar experiences. 

SISTERHOOD MEMBERSHIP AND FRIENDS



We invite all women to support Sisterhood by becoming a member. Sisterhood makes a difference to our Temple community by providing Onegs year-round, providing interesting programming, and by

contributing financial support to the Temple, the religious school, the ECEC, camperships, Avodah, TASTY and more. Even if you never come to meetings, as long as you support what Sisterhood does for the Temple, having you as a member helps us continue to provide the services we provide.

Membership dues are: Member \$45.00; Sponsor \$72.00; Patron \$118.00.

Our bylaws state that all Sisterhood members must be Temple members in good standing and that only women are eligible to join. Sisterhood has a brand-new program called **Friends of Sisterhood**. Anyone who is not eligible for Membership, i.e., men and non-Temple members, who contributes to Sisterhood an amount equal to the Sisterhood dues, is designated a “Friend of Sisterhood” and will be able to attend our paid-up event and will be able to attend Sisterhood events at the same price as a Sisterhood member.

Someone who is a “Friend of Sisterhood” is not a member of Sisterhood, and consequently would not be able to vote in Sisterhood elections, hold an elected office or chair a committee.

Our “Friends of Sisterhood” program allows male Temple members and others in the community who support Sisterhood to show their support by becoming our Friend. It means husbands of Sisterhood members can become our Friends and can join their wives at our programs without paying the \$5 fee. It means we are a more inclusive and welcoming organization.

We encourage all Temple members to show their support of everything Sisterhood does by becoming either members or Friends of Sisterhood. And encourage your family and friends, who might be members of other Temples, or unaffiliated, to show their support of Sisterhood by becoming our Friend as well.

CAMPERSHIPS


Did you have a child who attended a Jewish camp, or went on a trip to Israel this past year? Did you know that every year






A very special thanks to Ben Schecter and the young men of Boy Scout Troop 911! Ben completed his Eagle Scout project in July at TAS. The scope of the project addressed the front of the main building where there is a planter box adjacent to the parking lot, the front garden area with metal bench seating and the south side of the main building facing the school office. The project focused on removal of the heavy water plants and shrubs, replacing them with drought tolerant shrubs and plants while also improving the look of the overall landscape. Additionally, Ben repaired the sprinkler system in the areas and put in a new drip system to also minimize the amount of water required.

A special thanks to Armando at Saticoy Nursery located on San Fernando Mission Boulevard, for assisting with the project and providing the plants and landscaping materials at minimal to no cost.





2016 FOOTBALL SQUARES



The Men of Temple Ahavat Shalom (MoTAS) announce the 2016 season of “Football Squares,” the full-season version of the Super Bowl game many of you participate in. The earnings from this program (potentially as much as \$3,000) are used to support special Temple programs and needs; funding that is above and beyond money available from normal TAS budget allowances.

A brief reminder of how the game works:

1. There is a chart set up, numbers 0-9 across the top for the ‘home team,’ and 0-9 down the side, for the ‘visiting team,’ and the numbers are randomly arranged. There are 100 total squares on the board. The games are played over the 16 Monday Night Football games in Fall 2016 (the first Monday we’re using the game closest to TAS). Your \$50 contribution gives you one square in the grid for all 16 weeks. As the grid numbers are randomly selected, it makes no difference where your square is. Additionally, each game will have a different randomly selected number arrangement for the home and visiting teams. Thus, it is rare that you will have the same set of two numbers for two different weeks.
2. Payouts are \$25 for a matching score for home and visitor (determined by the last digit of the score, so 17 is a 7) for each of the first, second, and third quarters. The final score earns \$50. You can win once, twice, or maybe all four times in a week.
3. Any adult is eligible to play. One entry per individual; a couple, each participating, can play two squares (for a \$100 contribution).




