



MEN OF TEMPLE AHAVAT SHALOM (MoTAS)

What's an Emoji Putting Green, and why is it at TAS? What does it have to do with the ancient story of Joseph revealing himself to his brothers in Egypt? Will I need to ask for forgiveness after posting this article?

It was a cold January morning. The Men of TAS were happily eating breakfast and listening to Kelzmer music. But not me, I was preparing to give my first Dvar Torah. Our regular leader of Dvar Torah, Mel Janis, was out sick. I called the meeting to order and began my Dvar.

"In this week's Torah portion, Joseph reveals his identity to his brothers in Egypt. There's a little known reason they were in Egypt. Does anyone know what it was?"

One of the men says, "To buy grain."

"That was part of it," I replied. "But the main reason was Golf! They played 18 holes at the Cairo Club. The sand traps there are murder."

In honor of that game, I presented the Emoji Putting Green. It's an indoor executive office putting green with sand traps. The yellow golf balls all have happy Emoji faces on them. Club sizes fit ages 3 to adult.

This is part of our effort to reach out to families and include them in our events. It is also a conversation starter about our Golf Tournament and what Men of TAS has to offer.

When I saw Mel at Friday night services, I was excited to tell him about my Dvar. I think he was happy. His eyes grew wide, and he put both arms around me. On the other hand, maybe he was mad and was throwing left and right hooks?

Besides golf, why is the story of Joseph forgiving the brothers significant?

This is the first recorded moment in history in which one human being forgives another.

I encourage you to read this article by Rabbi Jonathan Sacks about how this event transformed the human situation the world over.
