MARCH 9, BOOK GROUP SELECTION, *HOW'S YOUR FAITH? AN UNLIKELY SPIRITUAL JOURNEY* BY DAVID GREGORY. CATHY MEYERS, FACILITATOR

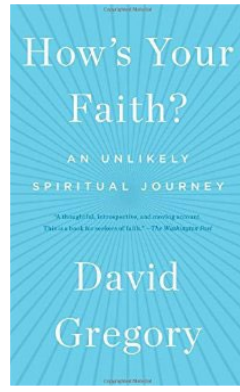


Raised by a Catholic mother and a Jewish father, David Gregory had a strong sense of Jewish cultural and ethnic identity, but no real belief—until his marriage to a Protestant woman of strong faith who inspired him to explore his spirituality for himself and his growing family. The former NBC newsman and *Meet the Press* moderator, Gregory probes various religious traditions to better understand his own faith and answer life's most important questions: who do we want to be and what do we believe?

David's journey has taken him and into the heart of Orthodox Judaism and inside Christian mega-churches. It has brought him back to his childhood, where belief in God might have helped him through his mother's struggle with alcoholism and through a difficult period

of public scrutiny and his departure from NBC News.

David approaches his faith with the curiosity and dedication you would expect from a journalist accustomed to holding politicians and Presidents accountable. Gregory explores why spiritual journeys are always worthwhile.

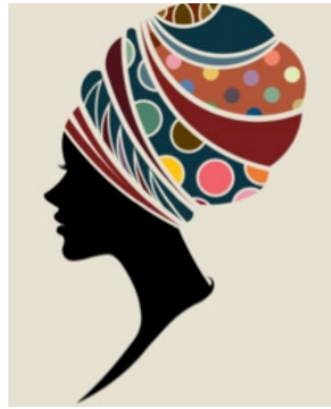
MARCH MEETING - ART EXPERIENCE

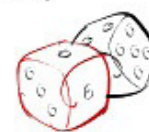

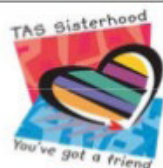

2017 BASKETBALL SQUARES



The Men of Temple Ahavat Shalom (MoTAS) announce the 2017 edition of "Basketball Squares," the NCAA Final Four version of our popular "Football Squares" game for the Men's and Women's semifinal and final games in the NCAA Basketball Championships, March 31 – April 3, 2017. The earnings from this program (potentially as much as \$1800) are used to support special Temple programs and needs; funding that is above and beyond money available from normal TAS budget allowances. **New for 2017: Basketball Squares covers both the Men's and Women's Final Four!**

A brief reminder of how the game works:

1. There is a chart set up, with the numbers 0-9 across the top for the "home" team (the school located closer to TAS) and down the side for the "away" team for each men's and women's game, and the numbers are arranged randomly for each grid. There are 100 total squares on the board. Your \$36 contribution gives you one square in each grid (same in each grid). Since the grid numbers are randomly selected, it makes no difference where your square is.
2. Payouts are \$150 for both the halftime and final scores of each game. You can win once or twice in a game. If the board is not fully subscribed, the payout is proportional based on the number of subscribed squares.
3. To address the possibility that all 100 squares might not be subscribed, the following is the procedure for empty squares that win: each player will make a guess as to what the total number of points both teams will score. This number will be used to settle all cases, for all games. If you purchase more than one square your "number" will apply for all your squares. Closest to actual score wins (payouts divided with ties). If there is no halftime winner, the final score prediction will still be used. For example: NCAA 73-59 = "132" (73 + 59)
4. Any adult is eligible to play. A player can reserve up to 3 squares and up to 3 more for their partner/spouse.

Official rules, an on-line signup form, and printable signup forms are on the MoTAS website at <http://squares.tasnorthridge-motas.org>. **Payment must be received by Wednesday, March 29, 2017. Unpaid squares will be cancelled and made available to other participants.**

Your support of this program is greatly appreciated. You might win some money, but the Temple is the big winner! A warm "Thank you" from the Men of TAS.

Now, a little information – What is CarFit?

CarFit is an educational program that offers older adults the opportunity to check how well their personal vehicles "fit" them.

Why is CarFit important? Older drivers are often the safest drivers in that they are more likely to wear their seatbelts, and less likely to speed or drink and drive. However, older drivers are more likely to be killed or seriously injured when a crash does occur due to the greater fragility of their aging bodies.

Older drivers can improve their safety by ensuring their cars are properly adjusted for them. A proper fit in one's car can greatly increase not only the driver's safety but also the safety of others.

How is a CarFit check completed? At a CarFit event, a team of trained technicians work with each participant to ensure they "fit" their vehicle properly for maximum comfort and safety. A CarFit check takes approximately 20 minutes to complete.

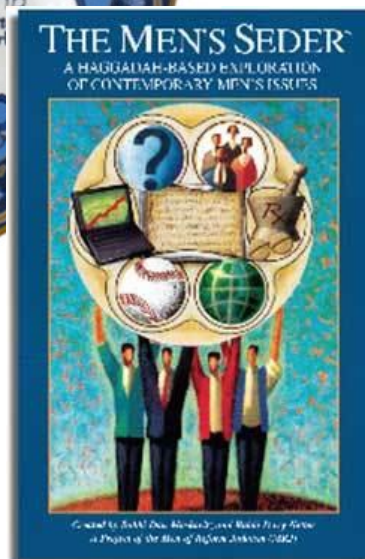

MoTAS Men's Seder

On Sunday, April 2, you are invited to join the Men of TAS at our annual Men's Seder. This special service and dinner, modeled after the traditional Passover Seder, provides a comfortable and 'safe' space for the men of TAS to explore and celebrate what it means to be a contemporary Jewish man. The text of our special haggadah, developed by MRJ, explores issues that pertain specifically to men; the service and dinner provides a place to take those issues, share them, discuss them, and wrestle with them.



Our Men's Passover Dinner will consist of traditional Passover foods -- water, wine, homemade charoset, and more (maybe even gefilte fish) -- as well as barbeque chicken and tri-tip from one of our favorite BBQ restaurants in Northridge (for what man doesn't love barbeque).
