A chance meeting in the lobby of their apartment building developed into a marriage proposal from Alex Lee, a Hawaiian born man of Korean and Japanese descent. There was a requirement, however, before Sharon would say, "yes." Although she fell in love with Alex, she was not in love with New York. After visiting an aunt in LA, she discovered the place where she wanted to spend her life. Fortunately for us, Alex, an educator, agreed, and they relocated to Los Angeles more than a decade ago.

The Furman-Lees settled in Woodland Hills. Sharon has been a teacher at Milken High School for 10 years, and Alex is the Director of Admissions at The Village School in Pacific Palisades. They are the proud parents of two young sons—Kai, 7, and Lanai, 5 ½, who will become students in our Religious and Hebrew schools.

Sharon describes her home as a glorified farm. She loves to garden and grows peppers and tomatoes as well as dries seeds to plant. She said, "I am a pet person." The family has three dogs, two bunnies and will soon add chickens to their menagerie.

Her boundless energy is evident when you meet her. That energy has inspired her to enroll in a doctoral program at Cal Lutheran, where she will earn an EDD. She loves to learn and do research and enjoys historical movies, museums and the Metropolitan Museum in New York. Sharon loves music, studied keyboard as a child and performed in high school. She is currently studying violin with Lanai, while Alex is learning guitar with Kai. Both boys also take piano lessons. In her "spare" time Sharon loves to hike and travel to the desert or mountains. She is a contributing writer for a blog called *Shavuah Israeli*, which focuses on parenting and education.

"I hope to continue the great work that has been done in the TAS school," she said.

"I have so many ideas about creating strong family ties, enriching the community and inspiring our students. I bring a strong sense of purpose to help this community succeed," added Sharon.







Growing up on idyllic St. Thomas in the early 1800s, Rachel dreams of life in faraway Paris. Rachel's mother, a pillar of their small refugee community of Jews who escaped the Inquisition, has never forgiven her daughter for being a difficult girl who

refuses to live by the rules. Growing up, Rachel's salvation is their maid Adelle's belief in her strengths, and her deep, lifelong friendship with Jestine, Adelle's daughter. But Rachel's life is not her own. She is married off to a widower with three children to save her father's business. When her husband dies suddenly and his handsome, much younger nephew, Fréderick, arrives from France to settle the estate, Rachel seizes her own life story, beginning a defiant, passionate love affair that sparks a scandal that affects all of her family, a marriage forbidden by the synagogue of St. Thomas on grounds that a Jewish man could not marry his aunt, even an aunt by marriage. But the couple stayed together. The public debate over Rachel and Frédérick's marriage continued for eight years; the synagogue of St. Thomas finally granted

formal acknowledgement of the marriage in 1833.

During that time the Pissarros had four sons: Felix, Moses

Alfred, Jacob Camille (known as Camille) and Aaron Gustave who grew up along with Rachael's three step children from her marriage to Isaac. Camille, her favorite son, became one of the greatest artists of France.



"The Marriage of Opposites" showcases the beloved, bestselling Alice Hoffman at the height of her considerable powers. Once forgotten to history, the marriage of Rachel and Fréderick is a story that is as unforgettable as it is remarkable.


